#### Access to Food-Food Banks and Other Food Services

As of March 23, <u>St. Mary's Food Bank Alliance</u>, <u>United Food Bank</u>, <u>Desert</u>

<u>Mission Food Bank</u>, <u>Community Food Bank of Southern Arizona</u>, and <u>Yuma Community Food Bank</u> are all open. Some are changing to drive-up protocols and, of course, they are all increasing cleaning frequency.

Food pantries, soup kitchens and other charities that serve people may need to change their hours or distribution models. If you or someone you know needs help with food, visit **this <u>directory to find an agency</u>** that serves your (or their) zip code and call ahead. Even if no one answers, many organizations will have an outgoing message with more information.

Many Farmers Markets accepting SNAP benefits are still open but Farm Express (which delivers produce to senior centers, senior living facilities, and health clinics) decided to temporarily ground both buses.

As in other state, AZ is seeing a growing number of families needing SNAP benefits to meet their nutrition needs. Families and individuals need to apply <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a>. Governor Ducey secured a waiver to ease restriction on SNAP benefits; provide to eligible families the maximum benefits for up to 2 months, extend the certification period by 90 days and providing \$5.70 per day of school closure to families with kids eligible for free/reduced price meals (a.k.a. The Double Up Food Buck is temporarily removing the \$20 daily Double Up Food Bucks incentive limit, effective immediately at all active Double Up sites (<u>list can be found here</u>). Double Up is also now accepted at Food City Stores in Yuma and San Luis.

#### **TANF**

Work requirements have been waived for the duration of the emergency declaration. Apply here.

#### WIC

**WIC** is another important resource for pregnant moms and families. WIC remains open, and is offering remote ways of providing services to promote social distancing and avoid office visits. #### COVID-19: AT&T's Commitment

In honoring the Keep Americans Connected Pledge, for the next 60 days they will:

- Waive any late fees that any residential or small business customers incur because of their economic circumstances related to the coronavirus pandemic
- Open their WiFi hotspots to any American who needs them.

#### Sparklight (formerly CableOne)

Sparklight will be making unlimited data available on all internet services for the next 30 days and waiving late fees for its customers for the next 60 days. Additionally, Sparklight is offering payment deferrals to customers who call to make arrangements. The company plans to reassess after 30 days based on the continued impact and evolving nature of the virus.



#### CenturyLink

For the next 60 days, CenturyLink has committed to waive late fees and to not terminate a residential or small business customer's service due to financial circumstances associated with COVID-19. They are also suspending data usage limits for consumer customers during this time period due to COVID-19.

#### Rent & Mortgage

Governor Ducey made an official declaration that will stop evictions for 120 days due to COVID-19 developments.

<u>Fannie Mae, Freddie Mac (the Enterprises)</u> and the Federal Home Loan Banks are taking steps to help people who have been impacted by the coronavirus. If your ability to pay your mortgage is impacted, and your loan is owned by Fannie Mae or Freddie Mac, you may be eligible to delay making your monthly mortgage payments for a temporary period, during which:

- You won't incur late fees.
- You won't have delinquencies reported to the credit bureaus.

Foreclosure and other legal proceedings will be suspended

#### Tips For Renters Facing Evictions

You must contact your landlord in writing and include documentation to support delaying eviction. Fill out the document created by Community Legal Services for renters affected by COVID-19 and give to your landlord.

If you have tested positive for COVID-19 or are quarantined because others in your home have the virus or symptoms, collect documentation from a medical provider.

If you can't work, lost your job or are homebound to care for a school-age child, collect notices from your employer and pay stubs.

If you don't have supporting documents, write a statement explaining your current conditions such as illness or loss of income, etc.

Assistance with rent and utilities may be available through the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program.

If you need legal assistance in Northern Arizona contact <u>Peoples Legal Services (DNA)</u>, in Central Arizona contact <u>Community Legal Services (CLS)</u> and in Southern Arizona contact <u>Southern Arizona Legal Aid (SALA)</u>.

#### **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

#### Can I Be Evicted During Covid-19?

Yes. But a 120-day order delaying evictions for renters impacted by COVID-19 in Arizona is in effect. Make sure you communicate with your landlord.

#### **Should I Continue To Pay My Rent?**

Yes. You are still responsible for paying rent. Failure to pay rent can result in an eviction, now or later. If your landlord will not take rent money, save your rent money and contact Legal Aid.

#### If I Cant Pay My Rent Can My Landlord Lock Me Out Or Turn Off Utilities?

No. Your landlord is not allowed to lock you out of your home or turn off your utilities forcing you to leave. The only way they can force you out is by evicting you through the court. If your landlord tries to force you out in other ways, contact Legal Aid immediately.

#### Can My Landlord Prevent Me From Allowing A Guest Into My Apartment Or Home?

Check with your landlord about new rules and restrictions during this public health crisis
